



Costa Rica Tourist Requirement

- Original passport should be valid for at least six months from the date of date of arrival in India
- One Visa Application Form to be filled completely and signed by the applicant
- One recent colour photograph, 35x45 mm in size with white background with complete name of applicant at the back
- Police clearance certificate (duly Apostilled)
- Covering letter addressed to the Consulate including the Following Information:
 - * Full name, nationality, passport no, validity, address and purpose of the Trip.
 - * Expected time of stay in Costa Rica, approximate date of arrival and departure.
 - * Expected ports of entry and exit, occupation.
 - * Address in Costa Rica
 - * Address for notification, date and signature of the passenger
- Proof of sufficient funds
 - * Bank statement for last 6 months including address and telephone number of the bank, A/C holder's name & address with stamp and signature of the bank
 - * Last 3 months salary slips
 - * Income Tax returns for last 3 years
- Copy of the Passport's first page & last page and all used pages required.
- Proof of Airline Reservation – round trip flight Itinerary.
- If you are self employed: registration of the company/ partnership deed/ Memorandum of Article (MOA) is required
- All the applications are referred to Costa Rica for approval.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Indian Nationals are no longer required to apply for the visa to enter Costa Rica, if the visitors are holders of:

A valid tourist visa, crew member's visa, or business visa to enter the U.S., Canada or the countries of the European Union. The tourist visa must be stamped in their passport and valid for at least 3 more months.

OR

A permanent residence (green card), student visa (F1, J1), work visa (H1B, G4, etc.), or refugee status in the United States, and/or in any country member of the European Union or Canada, valid for a minimum of 6 months. Residency extensions stamped on passport are not accepted.

These visitors will be given the visa on arrival at Costa Rica.
